- [Total Russian combat losses since February 24, 2022, to 13 October 2025](#): in personnel – 1 123 950, tanks – 11 251, ACV – 23 345, artillery system – 33 599.
- Russians have already suffered [over 12,000 losses](#) since the Dobropillia counteroffensive began.
- On the night of 10 October, [Russia launched more than 30 missiles and over 450 drones targeting Ukraine's critical infrastructure](#).
- [Over 100,000 foreign-made components](#) found in the drones and missiles Russia used to attack Ukraine on the night of October 5.
- President Zelensky has stated that [Ukraine is already successfully employing its own the Neptune and Flamingo](#) missiles in tandem.
